Winter Wellness and Influenza 2025



Influenza (also called flu) is a highly contagious viral infection of the airways that spreads easily from person to person through coughing, sneezing and close contact. It affects people of all ages but is especially serious for vulnerable patients. Annual vaccination is the most important measure to prevent influenza and its complications. Now is the time to protect your patients as all Queenslanders are eligible for the free flu vaccines in 2025.

Things to consider:

- Does the practice operate a vaccine clinic or individual appointment options?
- Identify patient cohorts using the practice clinical software and/or Primary Sense reports.
- Leverage integrated email and SMS systems to recall patients for a vaccine appointment.
- Implement or utilise existing online booking systems to enable patients to schedule their own appointments.

Review systems and processes:

- Review and update your practice Vaccine Management Protocol (VMP).
- Ensure all practice staff are informed of the Vaccine Management Protocol (VMP) and its location.
- Ensure staff are trained in cold chain and vaccine management procedures.
- Verify that designated staff are trained in vaccine administration and documentation requirements.
- Assemble an anaphylaxis response kit and ensure appropriate signage indicates its location.
- Ensure all staff are trained in the infection control procedures.
- Revise risk management and reporting procedures, including those related to needle stick injuries and adverse events.

Contact Practice Support

Setting up a dedicated vaccine clinic:

- Clearly outline roles and responsibilities for clinic staff.
- Evaluate suitable booking systems, such as manual or online options.
- Identify and remind eligible patients to attend the clinic for vaccinations, utilising the Primary Sense Winter Wellness report.
- Choose an effective layout and signage to facilitate patient flow, including waiting areas, medical screening, and treatment area(s).
- Provide patient resources and information that is accessible and supportive for all individuals, including those from culturally and linguistically diverse (CALD) backgrounds.
- Ensure practice staff are trained and have demonstrated knowledge in the proper storage, handling and administration of vaccines.
- Schedule staff breaks to promote wellbeing.

Promotion and awareness:

- Update the information on the practice website and social media, and enhance awareness by displaying signs in the waiting area, restrooms, consulting rooms, and treatment rooms.
- Use electronic booking platforms or patient management software to send invitations to patients via SMS, email, or letters.
- Activate the Primary Sense prompts to notify the GP when vulnerable patients are present and due for vaccinations.
- Use electronic booking platforms to enable patients to schedule online vaccine appointments or vaccine clinic appointments.
- Leverage Primary Sense reports, including *Winter Wellness* and *Patients Booked in with Missing PIP QI Measures* to proactively reach out to patients who do not have a vaccine recorded in their file.
